resolution: respond to Klein that according to the Charter, the Mennonites are obligated to help maintaining the postal service, but are also freed from the obligation to provide quarters to anybody; furthermore, there are no available buildings, and no opportunity to build one quickly, as well as no real need for a postal station in Neuenburg.

document: a letter from the Land Survey Office, stating that after receiving the orders from the Senate regarding the changes in the division of land between the Josefsthal and **Kronsgarten** colonies according to the suggestions of the Office on Behalf of the Foreign Settlers, a man has been sent to these colonies from the Land Survey Office in order to draw up the new plans of the colonies with the help of an official from the Office on Behalf of the Foreign settlers; meanwhile, the records indicate that the Office initially wanted to transfer some extra land that belonged to the Josefsthal colony to the Kronsgarten Mennonites, but later revised this decision because of the need to settle in Josefsthal the Swabian colonists, resolving to give the Kronsgarten colonists a different plot of land of the same size.

resolution: relate to Pleshenkov that, when the surveyor arrives to Josefsthal, Pleshenkov should instruct him that 231 desyatinas 2241 square sazhens of land on the left bank of the Samara river, "parallel to the plot of Major Kustchenkov," should go to Kronsgarten; signed Brigontsi
